1. Brewers – 9-1 (NL1) (1) – With one of the premier team performances in SWBL history, the 9-1 Brew Crew is showing they are the whole wiffle package. With this team, Peter has given him and his teammate's a chance for their first Championship of their careers. There's always a chance for a loss in the first round when MVP, Blake Spencer is in the box. Whoever pitches for the Brewers will have to pitch lights out.
2. Rays – 8-2 (AL1) (2) – Have home field advantage throughout the playoffs if they can continue winning but will run into one of the two teams that they lost to during the regular season in the Finals. Will Paul join the 3-championship club in 2013?
3. Yankees – 6-4 (AL2) (3) – The Yankees clinched their first playoff spot of the franchise era, winning their final game against divisional rival, Royals. The bash brothers are back as this team hit the most home runs, becoming the first team that every player hits at least 30 on the season. They face the reigning champs in their first round.
4. Rockies – 6-4 (NL2) (4) – Snuck into the playoffs with some help from other teams, but also got their job done, going 3-1 in interleague play, only losing to the Royals.
