

2015 Day 2 Power Rankings:

1. Royals (4-1) (2) – It's not an undefeated season, but it was two runs away from starting like one. Ty is in his own version of a Sophomore slump, (which would be a great season for most) and Gus and Spencer are keeping this team in every game. Gus is also in strong contention for another CY Wiffle award, almost pitching a perfect game against the Yankees. The hope will be for Edloe to find his swing or this team could fall just short of a Championship again in Season 13.

2. Brewers (4-1) (3) – The Brew Crew is back, and for Peter and PG, they are back with authority. Both of their All Star representatives are off to a fantastic start as both are in the MVP race after Saturday. Peter is mere RBIs away from the triple crown as well. Kyle and Olderman have taken on the role of co-aces and the Brewers are on pace to do some damage for the rest of the season.

3. Yankees (3-2) (4) – With still no Scott in sight, the pinstripes just keep hanging in there. The biggest win came against the Rays as the Yankees are a half game up on them in the standings. John is hitting like he did back in 2011 and Sam is becoming that bash brother we thought he would. Jackson is doing well on the mound, but more surprising is he is 4th in batting average after Saturday's games. 4. 5. 7.
