1. Braves, 5-0 (Koetting Eye Center 1)(5)

There were many big surprises in the first half of Season 18, but possibly none more surprising than the only undefeated team being the Braves. The Royals/Athletics combo team, has won on the pitching side of the ball, with Gus and Sam leading in the CY Wiffle race. On offense, Gus Skibbe is the team's MVP, hitting almost .800 on the season. If Sam, Steve, or Paul can just hit over .500 for the remainder of the year, Gus will have the complement he is looking for and this offense could really take off. Good pitching will only take you so far as the Braves play all four of their games tomorrow against opponents in the top five of these power rankings.

2. Twins, 3-1 (Glendale CDJR 1)(2)

2 games Friday and 2 games Saturday, all with Bogad. Spencer is the MVP leader and if he wasn't missing four games, he may have been in contention for back to back for the award. While Chris may have one error, he looks as good as ever in left, and Edloe Donnan picked up another complete game win on the mound, his second in two years. Will Rath returned on the mound to get two wins for the Twins Saturday morning, and Cory McArthy has been an incredible addition, looking to not slow down after his National Rookie of the Year campaign in 2019. Cory also is the only person so far to hit the 50/50 bucket! Four games tomorrow, all without Bogad as this potent offense looks to continue to roll to possibly another Chris Meador championship.

3. Brewers, 4-2 (Glendale CDJR 2)(3)

A great start for the Brew Crew as they look to be possibly the best overall hitting lineup in the league. PG's emergence as a stud on both sides of the ball has always been known, but this year is proving he will be in that position for years to come. Peter is on a tear this season, hitting more home runs in half of a season than he hit all of 2019. Derek Cornell is a great spark plug for this team, and Josh Rogers gets the call to replace Kyle "Tiger Woods" Cornell; looking impressive as a fill in, looking for that longer-term SWBL contract. 6. Expos, 2-3 (Koetting Eye Center 3) (6)

Before that though, they had a two game winning streak beating the rookie Marlins team and Jimmy Nelson shutout the Brewers as his knuckleball was dancing something fierce. The Rockies and Astros then combined to score 26 runs the next two games with the Expos only scoring 4 combined to end their day under .500. Captain Kevin Wiethuchter will look to right the ship as he continues to vie for a Hall of Fame bid on the side.

7. Yankees, 1-3 (Glendale CDJR 3)(1)

The pattern seems to have continued for this franchise as the reigning champs are without John Calloway sure, but Jackson Crosley has been a hitting machine and still they find themselves 1-3 after a truly underwhelming Saturday. Early losses to the Twins and Rockies had the Yankees starting 0-2, then a close win against the Astros, and they end their day with a loss to the Braves. Most of their games have been close as Scott Pohle continues to lead his team with amazing offensive power, and Kevin Pohle is putting together a nice RF Gold Hands resume himself, giving up his body for many spectacular plays. This is a team that can beat you handedly when firing on all cylinders and you gotta believe with five games tomorrow, they will hit their sweet spot soon to crawl out of this uncharacteristically low ranking.

8. Marlins, 0-4 (Glendale CDJR 4)(8)
